OUT-standing

The Division 2 Final was a see-saw contest filled with game-changing plays. When the dust settled, Owosso had the school's first-ever MHSAA title.

Owosso High School sports hadn't done much on the MHSAA finals level over the last couple of years – until 2021.

Surviving two Marysville homers and two errors, junior pitcher Macy Irelan kept the Vikings at bay enough to lead the Trojans to an 8-5 victory that clinched the Division 2 softball championship at Michigan State's Secchia Stadium.

The championship was Owosso's first MHSAA Finals title in any sport.

Irelan won all 37 games for the Trojans (37-3) this season, but none bigger than Saturday's.

"We fell behind, but we wanted to come back to show we deserved this," said Irelan, who had an 0.55 ERA coming into the game. "It was a good team win. How the game worked out and how it went, we were going to do our best."

No-hit through two innings with four strikeouts, Marysville's hitters looked like they were in for a long morning against Owosso's Irelan.

That all changed in the third inning when pitcher Kirsten Smith helped her own cause with a three-run homer.

"I can't tell you how many years this game took off my life," said Owosso coach JoEllen Smith, who has led the program to 808 wins since taking over in 1983. "That was a huge emotion. Then we had a couple of plays that went against us. Our kids muscled through it. Postseason has been huge for us. They've never given up."

Owosso got on the board first on an RBI double up the centerfield gap by first baseman Reyn Tuttle in the first inning. Jamie Maier stretched the lead to 2-0 on a blast over the centerfield field fence to lead off the second.

Irelan had the Marysville hitters under control until the third inning. She gave up singles to Brandi Bassett and Avery Woodard before Smith stunned Owosso with a three-run homer over the centerfield fence to give the Vikings a 3-2 lead.

"Give Owosso credit; their pitcher is tremendous," said Marysville coach Ryan Rathje. "We got some hits off her and put the ball in play. Owosso has some strong bats throughout their lineup. They were able to come up with some key hits, and they had some good defensive plays."

Marysville (31-7) – making its first championship game appearance since 1991 – continued to pound the ball, getting a homer from Callie Perrin to make it 4-2 in the fourth inning. Avery Wolters followed with a double. An error made it 5-2 and it would've been worse, but the Vikings had a runner thrown out at home.

Owosso began its comeback in the bottom of the fourth inning, leading off with three-straight singles followed by Madyson Rainey's hit driving in a run to make it 5-3. Irelan came through with a double to center to tie the game at 5-5 with Marysville still looking for the inning's first out. Owosso then took a 6-5 lead on a bounce-out to complete the four-run rally.

The Trojans added two more runs in the fifth inning. Kendall Anderson doubled and scored when Sydney Somers laced a singled to center. A throw trying to catch Somers at second went into the outfield, and she eventually scored as well.

Marysville led off the seventh inning with consecutive hits to put runners at first and third. But Irelan got two pop flies and a strikeout to seal the victory.

South Lyon 5, Allen Park 0

Allen Park was never able to solve South Lyon pitcher **Ava Bradshaw** (right) in the 2021 MHSAA Division 1 Final. The freshman showed unbelievable poise on the mound and led the Lions (30-6-2) to a 5-0 victory over the Jaguars at Secchia Stadium.

She was in trouble only in the seventh inning, when Molly Hool led off with a double. But Bradshaw got the next three batters, striking out the last to clinch the program's first Finals title.

"She's always a mess before a game," said coach Dan DePaulis. "But, the way she trains, the way she plans for things...she's a competitor. She attacks hitters. She's just a really special kid."


Bradshaw scattered three hits, and also got the scoring started in the first inning with an RBI double after Grace Walters reached on an error. Julia Duncan's single scored another run to make it 2-0.

"Getting the lead helped" said Bradshaw. "My rise ball was working for me. It was on and that obviously helps. I had a great defense behind me. Every ball that was hit, I knew it was going to be caught. When you have that kind of confidence in your defense, it's easier to pitch."

After a rocky first inning, Allen Park pitcher Morgan Sizemore settled down and kept Allen Park in the game while the offense had a hard time solving Bradshaw, who pitched with minor stress.

She continually kept the Jaguars off balance and got great plays behind her. She also continued adding to the offense – after South Lyon loaded the bases on singles in the bottom of the fifth inning, Bradshaw's sacrifice fly produced a run to make it 3-0.


The Lions tacked on insurance in the bottom of the sixth inning on a two-run double by Riley Bourlier. – Perry A. Farrell

Richmond 2, Buchanan 1

Richmond senior Makayla Revord did what she's been taught since first lacing up the cleats as a young ball player. Keep your head down and run hard. So when she blooped a double down the right field line during the sixth inning of her team's Division 3 Final against Buchanan, she missed all the exciting action.

"I saw the ball land, and I kept going. I didn't look at anybody else running. I just wanted to keep going to get more runs," said Revord, whose hit drove in what turned out to be the game-winning run in her team's 2-1 victory over the Bucks. "When I popped up (at second base), I had no worries anymore. I knew that we had this."

Indeed they did. The Blue Devils scored twice in that sixth inning to rally from a run down and capture the second Finals championship in school history. The first came back in 2016 — also under current head coach Howard Stuart.

Richmond struggled against Buchanan starting pitcher Sophia Lozmack for the better part of six innings. The senior allowed just four hits while striking out six through five.

"She's a great pitcher. You can't take that away from her," said Revord, speaking of Lozmack. "She's got a great rise ball. She hits outside corners like nobody's business. We don't see a lot of that, so it took us a minute to catch up to that."

Eventually, the Blue Devils did catch up in the sixth. Sophomore Piper Clark started things off with a one-out double and moved over to third on a single by junior Lauren Creon. Senior Jaelyn Amhdar then singled down the left field line, scoring Clark and tying the game up at 1-1. One out later, Revord came up with the eventual game-winner.

Unionville-Sebewaing 14, Rudyard 1

There was a moment early in 2021 when Unionville-Sebewaing head coach Isaiah Gainforth had some doubts as to how good his team was going to be.

But all those doubts were erased as his team celebrated its 36th-straight victory in the Division 4 Final against Rudyard. The Patriots' 14-1 win over the Bulldogs capped off a remarkable season which saw the team break or tie three championship game records.

"We started the season 4-3," Gainforth said after his team captured its second-consecutive title. "We weren't pushing the panic button. We were playing the tough part of our schedule early on."

Gainforth's team righted the ship. The offense started hitting the ball, while senior starting pitcher Brynn Polega did her thing to near perfection.


USA (40-3) set the record for hits in a championship game, collecting 20 against the Bulldogs. Eight players had multiple hits, including senior Emily Rieman, whose four hits tied a championship game record.

Senior Maci Montgomery and junior Macy Reinhardt both had three hits and seniors Emma Stecker and Olivia Jubar, junior Laci Harris and freshman Gabriella Crumm each added two hits.

Polega, who had two hits herself at the plate, picked up the win in the circle. In the process, she set a championship game record for strikeouts in seven innings, with 19.

It was the 10th appearance in the championship game for USA, which has now won five titles in Division 4 (2009, 2015-16, 2019, 2021) and two more in Division 3 (2006-07).

Hackett Closes Spring with Title

Stephen Kwapis was headed off to Notre Dame to play baseball at his dream school. The Kalamazoo Hackett Catholic Prep senior captain couldn't leave high school without helping make another dream come true.

The Irish built an early lead and never looked back en route to defeating Marine City Cardinal Mooney 9-2 in the 2021 Division 4 Final at Michigan State's McLane Stadium.

"It's unreal," said a wide-eyed and giddy Kwapis, who went 2-for-4 with two runs scored and an RBI.

"I've been dreaming about this for my whole life, and for it to actually happen ... it hasn't hit me yet, honestly. I can't believe that just happened."

It was the first Finals win in school history for Hackett baseball, which reached the championship game for the first time.

Hackett (31-9) scored at least one run in each of the first four innings and received stellar pitching from senior Sam Shea and junior reliever Brenden Collins.

"It's surreal to watch these boys accomplish this," Irish first-year coach Smiley Verduzco said. "They worked so hard, and it's all about the boys. We've had some really tough games, and this was a really good baseball team that we beat. To be able to do this is very special for these young men."

Shea and Collins combined to limit Mooney to only four hits while striking out seven.

"They've been good all year, and to step on this stage and to come through like that is very special," Verduzco said.

Shea wasn't slated to pitch in the Final after starting the Semifinal. However, the lineup's big first inning against Glen Lake in the Semifinal allowed him to return after throwing only 23 pitches.

"I'm thankful that I was able to pitch in the last game because I didn't think that would happen," Shea said. "It was unbelievable to pitch in the championship game, and it was super important to get those early runs so we could calm down and play our usual baseball."

Kwapis had a strong belief in his team's ability to make a postseason run. He said it was apparent early due to the tight-knit bond.

"I knew the brotherhood that this team had, and that's what made this team so special," he said. "We all came together at the beginning of the year, and I just knew by the way we played that we could make it happen."

Hackett's bats were pivotal throughout the tournament, scoring 71 runs over its seven postseason games.

Isaac Backman also had two hits for Hackett, while Eli Backman and Steven Widger each had a hit and two RBI.

The Irish went ahead 2-0 in the first inning after a Kwapis RBI single and sacrifice fly from Shea.

They extended their lead to 8-1 after four innings.

"They came out hacking," Mooney coach Mike Rice said. "They were hitting the ball, and we haven't been squared up like that in a while. We tried our best and gave it our all, but at the end of the day they out-hit us and we made some defensive mistakes."

Mooney, also making its first Final appearance, committed four errors on the day and left 10 runners on base.

The Cardinals ended the season with a 28-7 overall record.

Grand Blanc 8, Portage Northern 3

Pitching and defense were staples of the Grand Blanc baseball team during its 2021 postseason push. Those two elements combined with timely hitting to help carry the Bobcats to an 8-3 victory over Portage Central in the Division 1 Final at Michigan State's McLane Stadium.

Grand Blanc allowed only seven runs over its seven postseason games.

The win capped off a season of firsts for the Bobcats (33-11), beginning with their first Regional title.

Grand Blanc senior center fielder Jonah Meleski, who had a hit and scored two runs, said the team peaked at the right time.


"This postseason has been insane, and we haven't given up very many runs at all," he said. "The pitching has been dominant, and everyone defensively has been locked in."

Freshman Nathan Fidelino's two-out RBI bloop single gave the Bobcats a 1-0 lead in the first inning. Moments later, Hunter Ames scored on a wild pitch to make it 2-0.

On defense, Grand Blanc left fielder AJ Maxwell made an amazing diving catch in the bottom of the inning to prevent at least one run from scoring.

The Bobcats broke it open in the fifth with six runs on five hits. They also took advantage of two Portage Central errors to go ahead 8-0.

Nate Helms, a junior, was brilliant on the mound until the sixth inning, when the Mustangs (35-5) touched him up for three runs. Northern's Luke Leto scored on an infield single and Gavin Brasosky belted a two-run homer over the right field fence.



Orchard Lake St. Mary's 9, Stevensville Lakeshore 0

Orchard Lake St. Mary's senior **Tommy Allman** (right) stole the show on the mound in the 2021 Division 2 Final.

His talented teammates did the same on the base paths.

Allman pitched six solid innings, and the Eaglets set a new Finals record for stolen bases in a decisive 9-0 win over Stevensville Lakeshore at Michigan State's McLane Stadium.

Top-ranked St. Mary's (43-1) won its second Division 2 championship in a row and the program's fifth Finals title overall. The 43 wins tied for the MHSAA record with four other teams.

"It was a good outing, and I was dialed in," said Allman. "I trusted my team behind me, and everything was working; the off-speed, curveball and slider."


Allman surrendered only two hits in 6 1/3 innings of work. He struck out seven and didn't allow a walk.

The Eaglets finished with 12 stolen bases. The total eclipsed the previous Finals record of nine, set by Colon in the 1989 Class D Final against Gaylord St. Mary's.

Alex Mooney and Ryan Mooney both tied the Finals individual record with three steals each.

Nolan Schubart broke a scoreless tie in the fourth inning with a two-RBI double. Ryan McKay followed with another double to drive in a pair and make it 4-0. The Eaglets finished with six runs in the inning, then added another three in the sixth.

Lakeshore finished the season at 28-12 overall. The loss was its first in a Final after winning back-to-back Division 2 titles in 2017 and 2018 and a Class B crown in 1990.



Grosse Pte. Woods U. Liggett 12, Travers City St. Francis 0

With a full head of steam, Grosse Pointe Woods University Liggett senior **Matthew Greene** slid into third base head first.

Greene was greeted with a big hug from coach Dan Cimini after his two-out, bases-loaded triple sealed a 12-0 win over Traverse City St. Francis in the 2021 Division 3 Final at Michigan State's McLane Stadium.

It was Green's second big hit of the game. He also doubled in the fourth inning to drive in a pair of runs. He finished the day 2-for-4 with five RBI.

"He's a great natural hitter, and he's been like that for us all year," Cimini said. "The double was gigantic, and the triple just iced it. We needed that."

The second-ranked Knights (31-5) claimed the program's sixth Finals championship, but first since 2016.

They finished runners-up in 2019, but entered this year with only two senior starters.

Liggett sophomore starter Jack Jones kept the Gladiators at bay and tossed a three-hit shutout. He struck out six and didn't allow a walk.

The Knights led 3-0 in the third inning before a 48-minute rain delay. They didn't let up after the halt, scoring five runs in the fourth inning and four more in the fifth.


The Knights finished with 11 hits and were led by freshman Preston Barr's 3-for-3 performance.

Freshman Reginald Sharpe went 2-for-2 with three RBI and two runs scored, while sophomore Jarren Purify also had a pair of hits.


"The guys hit the baseball, and put pressure on them," Cimini said. "(St. Francis) made a couple mistakes, but we were putting constant pressure on them."

Title IX Turns 50, and Results Speak Volumes

To say that American female athletes dominated the recent Olympics in Tokyo would be an understatement. Among the 66 medals earned by American female Olympians – most by any country in the history of the Games – were gold-medal performances by the U.S. basketball, volleyball, water polo and beach volleyball teams. Eighteen medals were earned by the U.S. women swimmers, female track and field athletes claimed 15 medals, and the U.S. women’s softball and soccer teams won silver and bronze medals, respectively.

In the past 30 years of the Olympic Games, the United States has dominated the women’s team sports of basketball (nine golds), soccer (four golds, one silver, one bronze) and softball (three golds, two silvers) — not to mention the untold number of medals in track and field. And this past summer, the U.S. women’s volleyball team claimed its first gold medal.

These performances by some of our nation’s most skilled female athletes never would have been possible without the passage of Title IX and the offerings of these sports through our nation’s schools. With the chance to play afforded by the landmark Title IX legislation in 1972, girls participation in several high school sports skyrocketed in the years that followed.

When the NFHS conducted its first participation survey in 1971, basketball and outdoor track and field were the primary girls sports, comprising about two-thirds of the 294,000 total. However, with the opportunity to play additional sports, girls flocked to volleyball and softball first, along with cross country and eventually soccer.

Soccer, in fact, has had the most remarkable growth. In 1971, only 700 girls were playing high school soccer. Twenty-five years later, that number had climbed to almost 210,000; and as the 50th anniversary of Title IX approaches, there are now almost 400,000 girls playing high school soccer – a staggering 56,200 percentage increase in 50 years. Soccer now ranks fourth in popularity among girls high school sports – all because of that opportunity in 1972.

There are many other success stories, however. The pre-Title IX survey in 1971 indicated that 1,719 girls were participating in cross country. With increases every year until 2015, today, there are 219,345 girls competing in high school programs and the sport ranks sixth in popularity.

Although participation numbers have leveled a bit the past 10 years, fast-pitch softball is another sport that flourished after the passage of Title IX. With fewer than 10,000 participants in 1971, the numbers quickly rose to 220,000 by 1985 and 343,000 by 2000, and softball is currently fifth among girls sports with 362,038 participants.

Since track and field and basketball were the primary sports in the early days of girls sports programs, increases in those sports have not been as dramatic; however, they remain the first and third most-popular sports, respectively,

today. Volleyball, however, much like soccer, continues its upward climb.

Without a doubt, volleyball has seen the steadiest increases among girls high school sports the past 50 years. After starting with 17,952 participants in 1971, the numbers jumped to 300,810 by 1990 and 409,332 by 2010 and 452,808 by 2018. During its climb, volleyball surpassed basketball as the No. 2 girls sport.

And among the top six girls sports from 2010 to 2018 (numbers are not available the past two years due to the pandemic), volleyball has gained the most participants (43,476), followed by soccer (32,549). And all of this has occurred thanks to legislation passed in 1972 that was not fundamentally meant to address opportunities for girls to participate in high school sports.

The NFHS is leading a yearlong celebration of the 50th anniversary of Title IX, which officially occurs on June 23, 2022. “Title IX at 50 – Celebrating and Growing Opportunities” is highlighting the law’s impact by celebrating the inspirational individuals and landmark moments in the history of Title IX, and continuing to grow the educational and competitive opportunities for the future.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2022

The Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 33 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2021-22 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2022-23 school year. This year, a total of 1,434 applications from 407 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored during the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

Eight student-athletes who are juniors at their schools during the 2021-22 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2021-22 are: **Sam Gibson**, Plainwell; **Brady Leistra**, East Grand Rapids; **Caroline Li**, Okemos; **Sam Matias**, Lansing Catholic; **Zar'ria Mitchell**, Saginaw Heritage; **Carney Salo**, Escanaba; **Brandon Thompson**, Petersburg Summerfield; and **Keira Tolmie**, Clarkston.

Those eight new members were selected from 114 applicants. That applicant total was 40 percent more than the total number of applicants who generally apply for SAC positions every year.

Applications for the next SAC class can be found on MHSAA.com and are now being accepted through April 25.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 122 schools from 46 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 12 MHSAA sports, and five will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. Last school year, due to COVID-19, the Council met nearly twice as many times, but virtually all but once when members met for an outdoor, socially-distanced session.

In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic

The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
