

That’s the beauty of educational athletics. The takeaways today are not the trophies and medals, but the life lessons learned and applied over years of sports.



# Sweeps Week

*Three of eight races turned out individual and team champions from the same schools at the 2020 MHSAA LP Finals.*

The record books will show that the big winners at the 2020 MHSAA Lower Peninsula Cross Country Finals were Fremont, Petoskey and Carson City-Crystal.

Each school not only boasted individual medalists, but also had strong enough supporting casts to claim team championships, thus sweeping the hardware in their respective Divisions.

What won't show up in the all-time champions lists is just how much each competitor last fall deserved a medal of honor.

The Covid pandemic, varied restrictions imposed by health boards across the state, a revamped Finals format and spectator limitations didn't stop the nearly 2,000 competitors from putting on their perennial show at Michigan International Speedway in Brooklyn.

The annual one-day event was spread over two days, and champions in each Division were determined by combining two separate heats, but that didn't diminish the accomplishments or the competition.

In fact, the obstacles might have elevated the performances like no other year.

Following is a look at 2020 in review.

## Girls Division 2

Petoskey was outmatched in 2019 and knew it.

"East Grand Rapids had an amazing year," Petoskey senior Emma Squires said. "Even at our best, we would have never beaten them."

It was a different story in 2020. The Northmen returned all five of their scoring runners from a team that took second a year earlier in Division 2. East Grand Rapids was ranked No. 1, just ahead of Petoskey, coming into last fall's Finals, but had graduated champion Anna Petr.

The loss of Petr was just the opening Petoskey needed to break through and win its first MHSAA championship by a 68-79 margin over the Pioneers.


This time, it was Petoskey that had the individual champion. Squires ran the fastest time in 17:54.56 to finish ahead of Mason freshman Meghan Ford, who ran 18:18.08.

It was the fourth MHSAA Final for Squires, who was 36th in 19:19.9 as a freshman, seventh in 18:45.3 as a sophomore and fifth in 18:27.1 as a junior.

Supporting Squires for Petoskey were Cambrie Smith (9th, 19:01.69); Noel Vanderwall (17th, 19:14.65); Sarah Liederbach (28th, 19:39.73), and Caroline Farley (36th, 19:54.99).

## Boys Division 4

When Carson City-Crystal's Coleman Clark crossed the finish line in the 2020 Division 4 Final, he raised his arms over his head and belted out a loud scream.

He had plenty of reasons to celebrate. The senior captured the individual title, beating out a loaded field in the second of two races in the Division with a 15:58.55.

And his Eagles also captured the school's first boys cross country team title since 1994.

"My goal was to come in here and win it," said Clark, who finished runner-up to Breckenridge's Mason Sumner in 2019. "And to have my team win as well, this is awesome."

As a team, Carson City-Crystal was solid one through five. Junior Ashton Keiffer finished 25th overall, earning all-state honors after running a time of 17:38.74. Also scoring for the Eagles were sophomore Brayden Clark and seniors Jared Shepler and Calvin Clark.

## Boys Division 2

It was a dream that formulated in the mind of a young runner before he ever put on a Fremont cross country singlet.

"It's something I've been working for the last five, six years probably," senior Nathan Walker said after winning the 2020 Division 2 championship.

"It's a dream come true. I've come to state meets since when I was in middle school."

Of more importance to Walker was winning a second straight team crown with long-time teammates. Fremont scored 61 points to outdistance runner-up St. Johns, which had 126.

Fremont has won four Division 2 championships and finished second five times over the last 20 years.

Fremont's top five runners all made all-state by placing among the top 30. Conor Somers was fifth in 16:02.55, Ben Paige was 18th in 16:31.55, Joshua Zervas was 26th in 16:37.39 and Adam Ward was 27th in 16:38.57 to complete Fremont's scoring.

### Division 1 Boys

Junior **Riley Hough** (right) of Hartland and senior Hobbs Kessler of Ann Arbor Skyline would have preferred settling it head-to-head. But both also understood the unique circumstances presented by the COVID-19 pandemic and appreciated any opportunity to compete in an MHSAA cross country championship.

Kessler ran the third-fastest time in the 25-year history of cross country Finals at Michigan International Speedway in the first of two Division 1 boys heats, only to be edged by a slightly greater performance by Hough in the second heat.

Hough started and finished strong, overcoming Kessler's faster third mile, to win the championship with a time of 14:49.62. It was a the second-fastest time in MIS history, trailing only the legendary 14:10.4 performance by three-time Olympian Dathan Ritzenhein of Rockford in 2000.

Kessler set the bar for Hough, posting a time of 14:51.79 in the first heat.

"It's not the way I would've liked it, but I can't complain too much. I did not think there was going to be a state meet," Kessler said. "It was more of a gift. You can complain about the format, but it still resembles a state meet pretty similarly. It's a blessing we got something in."

Romeo, ranked No. 1 all season, backed it up on the course by winning the team championship with 124 points. Caledonia was second with 156. Zander Cobb was second among team runners in 15:32.33, Jack Kelke seventh in 15:41.94, Joseph Rinke 22nd in 16:12.56, Owen Sharnas 25th in 16:18.55 and Jack Wallace 38th in 16:29.24 to lead Romeo.

### Division 1 Girls

Two familiar last names battled for the MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 1 girls cross country individual championship. Birmingham Seaholm senior Audrey DaDamio ran the first heat with individual qualifiers and runners from third-place teams at Regionals, crossing the line in 17:46.07.

She had to wait for the second heat to be run before celebrating her MHSAA championship. In that race, Ann Arbor Pioneer freshman Rachel Forsyth took first place in 17:55.60.

Both girls have older sisters who had second-place finishes at the MHSAA Finals. Rachel DaDamio was runner-up in 2014, and Anne Forsyth was second in 2016.

Like her older sister, Forsyth led Pioneer to a team championship. The Pioneers scored 129 points, with Traverse City Central taking second with 168.

Cookie Baugh was fourth among team runners in 18:10.78, Sarah Forsyth was 20th in 19:22.88, Charlotte Batra was 34th in 19:47.28 and Emily Cooper was 48th in 20:04.36 for Pioneer.

### Division 3 Boys

Never one to refuse a challenge, Benzie Central's Hunter Jones certainly accepted the challenge presented to him in 2020. The sophomore successfully repeated as Division 3 individual champion, finishing the course in 15:28.96. And part of the challenge was that he had to run by himself — nearly 30 seconds ahead of his next-nearest competitor and in the first of two races in his Division

Jones said he had to change up his strategy a bit due to the unusual circumstances.

"I usually look at my times and gauge myself out on the course, but I really didn't have that today," said Jones, who beat



his time on the same course from 2019 by 17 seconds. "I just have to remember to keep pushing through, and it worked out for me today. It felt great to get back here."

St. Louis captured the team title, finishing with a team score of 103 points to beat out Hart (116). The Sharks had four runners finish among the top 23 overall, led by junior Aaron Bowerman, who crossed the line ninth in 16:26.66. Also scoring for the team were senior Keegan Honig, junior Nate March, freshman Ben March and senior Joe Erickson.

It was the first Finals championship for the Sharks since 2005, when they took home a Division 4 crown.

### Division 3 Girls

Muskegon Western Michigan Christian's Abby VanderKooi did so well at the 2020 Finals that she couldn't wait to do it again. The junior won the Division 4 championship as both a freshman and sophomore. Last year, her team was bumped up to Division 3. The team did not qualify for the Finals. But VanderKooi did, and she shined on the state's biggest stage.

"My motivation was to break the course record (for Division 3)," VanderKooi said. "That was my goal. Hopefully, next year we move back to D4 because I want to break that record too."

Her time of 17:12.47 bettered the previous-best Division 3 time by more than 30 seconds.

"I'm very happy with that (time)," she said. "I just got this new watch, and it told me that my predicted 5K time was like a 17:22, and I was like, 'I'd love to run that time.'"

Hart captured its fourth straight Division 3 team championship, finishing three runners among the top five and four in the top 10 while piecing together a team score of 59. Freshman Alyson Enns was second overall in a time of 18:05.97. Senior Savannah Ackley was third, junior Audrianna Enns fifth and senior Lynae Ackley 10th overall. Junior Lauren Vanderlaan rounded out the team's scoring.

### Division 4 Girls

After all the uncertainty of the 2020 season, one thing is for sure. **Makenna Scott** (below) would be cuddled up with her puppy Milo following the Division 4 Final, gazing fondly at her cross country championship medal.

And who knows, she might even be eating a piece of ice cream cake.


"My parents told me last year that if I got top five I could get my dream puppy, so I got my Bernese Mountain Dog after getting fourth," said Scott, a junior from Glen Lake. "And this year, they were like, 'What do you want?' I told them a state championship, I don't need anything else — but maybe an ice-cream cake would be nice."

Scott earned it after moving into the lead down the final stretch and finished in a winning time of 19:30.2.

Lansing Christian's Madison Volz, a senior, was the race leader through the first two miles. But as she neared the three-mile mark, her legs gave out on her. She gutted it out and finished 12th overall, earning all-state honors. Her efforts helped the Pilgrims capture the Division 4 team championship with a score of 93 points.

"She said she wasn't going to finish, but she knew it mattered for the team score, so she got up and walked it in. That was actually the difference," her coach, Jonathan Watson said. "If she doesn't finish, we don't win."

Sophomore Ashlyn Kephart led Lansing Christian with a sixth-place finish. Senior Natalie Tebben was ninth, followed by Volz. Also scoring for the Pilgrims were freshman Hope Tebben and junior Mia Judd.

# Michigan International Speedway

**M**ichigan International Speedway is the site for the 2021 Michigan High School Athletic Association Lower Peninsula Cross Country Finals — the 26th time the Finals for all classes, both boys and girls, will be held on the same course on the same day.

Michigan International Speedway opened in 1968. Over 2.5 million tons of earth was moved to construct the two-mile oval and two, 1.9-mile road courses. The road courses wind through the infield and behind the backstretch, parts of which form the route the runners will follow today. Runners could see a variety of wildlife while winding through the hilly terrain behind the backstretch, including many deer which live on the property. MIS is home to one of Michigan's largest paid-admission sporting events each year. Fans also enjoy NASCAR and ARCA Menard Series events during race weekends in June and August.

Michigan International Speedway has provided the use of this unique, 1,400-acre facility, as well as many of its services to the MHSAA for this meet at a discounted rate. The MHSAA hopes you enjoy your visit to the beautiful Irish Hills.

## Spectator Viewing

Spectators may view today's races from the main grandstands, on pit road or from designated course locations. To access the infield/pit road area use the pedestrian/vehicle tunnel located south of the main grandstands in turn 1. Please note that access to the finish area, garage area and infield suites are restricted to the athletes, coaches and officials.

## Handicap Sections

Handicapped/wheelchair access is located in the main grandstands. Handicapped/wheelchair access is also available in Victory Lane near the finish area. Paved handicap parking is available in Lot 11, which is located across the street from the pedestrian/vehicle tunnel entrance.

## First Aid

Medical assistance is available through Jackson Community Ambulance services.

## Restrooms

Public facilities are available under the main grandstands. Facilities are also available on the infield.

Please take any recovered articles to the packet pick up/results room.

## Concessions & Finals Merchandise

Refreshments and food can be purchased in the concession area behind the south end of the main grandstands and in two locations near the infield awards area. Souvenir t-shirts, sweatshirts, souvenir programs and photographs will be sold at infield locations near the start line and awards area.

## Spectator Videotaping & Still Photography

Spectator videotaping and still photography are allowed at the Cross Country Finals with the understanding that the tape or images are for personal use only and not to be sold, leased, borrowed, rented or duplicated for commercial purposes or shown on television or the Internet. Videotaping and still photography must be done in a manner that does not obstruct the view of other spectators.


## Participating Team/Spectator Internet Streaming

# Title IX Turns 50, and Results Speak Volumes

To say that American female athletes dominated the recent Olympics in Tokyo would be an understatement. Among the 66 medals earned by American female Olympians – most by any country in the history of the Games – were gold-medal performances by the U.S. basketball, volleyball, water polo and beach volleyball teams. Eighteen medals were earned by the U.S. women swimmers, female track and field athletes claimed 15 medals, and the U.S. women's softball and soccer teams won silver and bronze medals, respectively.

In the past 30 years of the Olympic Games, the United States has dominated the women's team sports of basketball (nine golds), soccer (four golds, one silver, one bronze) and softball (three golds, two silvers) — not to mention the untold number of medals in track and field. And this past summer, the U.S. women's volleyball team claimed its first gold medal.

These performances by some of our nation's most skilled female athletes never would have been possible without the passage of Title IX and the offerings of these sports through our nation's schools. With the chance to play afforded by the landmark Title IX legislation in 1972, girls participation in several high school sports skyrocketed in the years that followed.

When the NFHS conducted its first participation survey in 1971, basketball and outdoor track and field were the primary girls sports, comprising about two-thirds of the 294,000 total. However, with the opportunity to play additional sports, girls flocked to volleyball and softball first, along with cross country and eventually soccer.

Soccer, in fact, has had the most remarkable growth. In 1971, only 700 girls were playing high school soccer. Twenty-five years later, that number had climbed to almost 210,000; and as the 50th anniversary of Title IX approaches, there are now almost 400,000 girls playing high school soccer – a staggering 56,200 percentage increase in 50 years. Soccer now ranks fourth in popularity among girls high school sports – all because of that opportunity in 1972.

There are many other success stories, however. The pre-Title IX survey in 1971 indicated that 1,719 girls were participating in cross country. With increases every year until 2015, today, there are 219,345 girls competing in high school programs and the sport ranks sixth in popularity.

Although participation numbers have leveled a bit the past 10 years, fast-pitch softball is another sport that flourished after the passage of Title IX. With fewer than 10,000 participants in 1971, the numbers quickly rose to 220,000 by 1985 and 343,000 by 2000, and softball is currently fifth among girls sports with 362,038 participants.

Since track and field and basketball were the primary sports in the early days of girls sports programs, increases in those sports have not been as dramatic; however, they remain the first and third most-popular sports, respectively,

today. Volleyball, however, much like soccer, continues its upward climb.

Without a doubt, volleyball has seen the steadiest increases among girls high school sports the past 50 years. After starting with 17,952 participants in 1971, the numbers jumped to 300,810 by 1990 and 409,332 by 2010 and 452,808 by 2018. During its climb, volleyball surpassed basketball as the No. 2 girls sport.

And among the top six girls sports from 2010 to 2018 (numbers are not available the past two years due to the pandemic), volleyball has gained the most participants (43,476), followed by soccer (32,549). And all of this has occurred thanks to legislation passed in 1972 that was not fundamentally meant to address opportunities for girls to participate in high school sports.

The NFHS is leading a yearlong celebration of the 50th anniversary of Title IX, which officially occurs on June 23, 2022. "Title IX at 50 – Celebrating and Growing Opportunities" is highlighting the law's impact by celebrating the inspirational individuals and landmark moments in the history of Title IX, and continuing to grow the educational and competitive opportunities for the future.

# Scholar-Athlete Award in 33rd Year Awarding Scholarships to Students

Thousands of students voluntarily extend their classroom day by taking part in extracurricular activities, often improving their academic achievements in the process. The value that such programs play in the total education of a high school student is highlighted through the MHSAA/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award, which will award \$2,000 scholarships to 32 top student-athletes and recognize over 2,000 other outstanding individuals in 2021-22.

Award is something that proves how important athletics are to the development of a well-rounded person.”

Students applying for the Scholar-Athlete Award must be graduating during the 2021-22 school year, carry a 3.5 grade-point average, and have previously won a letter in a varsity sport that the MHSAA sponsors postseason competition.



Applicants will also be required to show involvement in other school-community activities and submit an essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Each MHSAA member school is allowed to nominate a number of student-athletes based on the size of the school. Class A schools can nominate six boys and six girls, Class B four boys and four girls, Class C three boys and three girls and Class D two boys and two girls. The first 30 scholarships will be awarded based on this graduated scale, with two additional scholarships intended for minority applicants.

A committee composed of school administrators from across the state will select regional and statewide winners.

The 32 scholarship recipients will be recognized at the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Student Events Center in East Lansing in March 2022.

# Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

**E**ight student-athletes who are juniors at their schools during the 2021-22 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2021-22 are: **Sam Gibson**, Plainwell; **Brady Leistra**, East Grand Rapids; **Caroline Li**, Okemos; **Sam Matias**, Lansing Catholic; **Zar'ria Mitchell**, Saginaw Heritage; **Carney Salo**, Escanaba; **Brandon Thompson**, Petersburg Summerfield; and **Keira Tolmie**, Clarkston.

Those eight new members were selected from 114 applicants. That applicant total was 40 percent more than the total number of applicants who generally apply for SAC positions every year.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 122 schools from 46 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 12 MHSAA sports, and five will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. Last school year, due to COVID-19, the Council met nearly twice as many times, but virtually all but once when members met for an outdoor, socially-distanced session.

In addition to assisting in the promotion of the educational value of interscholastic

# The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.




