COUNTRY DAY LOCKS DOWN D3

YELLOWJACKET GOALIE SAVES BEST FOR LAST, AS USUAL, AT PLYMOUTH'S USA HOCKEY ARENA IN 2019

Nobody could have known it at the time, but Houghton's hockey team reached its quota of goals after only 56 seconds of play in the 2019 Division 3 MHSAA title game.

Sam Evola of Detroit Country Day might give up one goal, but that's going to be it when he plays at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth.

Evola closed the door the rest of the way, backstopping the Yellowjackets to their second straight MHSAA Division 3 championship with a 4-1 victory over Houghton.

Named the state's Mr. Hockey as a junior in 2018, Evola is one of the most clutch high school goaltenders to come out of Michigan.

When the pressure is at its greatest, Evola has been at his best, stopping 91 of 95 shots for a .958 save percentage in four Semifinal and Final games the last two seasons in Plymouth. He gave up only one goal in each of the four games.

Over 11 games during the two postseason runs, he gave up only nine goals.

So, it doesn't matter when the goals have come – there usually isn't going to be another one against Evola.

"There's a lot of pressure, but you've got to stay focused and keep your eye on the puck and keep your head in the game," Evola said. "You can't get distracted by what's on the outside. You've got to keep your focus on what's inside the rink."

Evola finished with 25 saves after allowing a goal by Seth Francois 56 seconds into the game.

"One of my mottos is you shouldn't give up a goal in the first minute or last minute of a period," Evola said. "I didn't do that. You've got to learn from your mistake, correct it and just keep it up. You can't keep thinking about that goal. It's going to egg on you and make you worse; you've got to bounce back."

Country Day (24-4-2) has won back-to-back MHSAA championships after ending a 37-year drought in 2018. After winning only one Regional in 26 years, the Yellowjackets

have become a force in Division 3, winning four straight Regionals. To hear eighth-year coach Frank Novock describe the evolution of his program, the current players are the beneficiaries of what was built by players from his earlier teams.

"The guys who came before these guys, the captains, we didn't have the greatest win-loss records, but the bar was set to a high standard," Novock said. "It's on cruise control with the leaders and seniors I have, and the same thing with the years past. It's not always easy, it's not always fun, but when you put that sweater on here, you're going to have to be part of it or you're going to be gone."

The Yellowjackets regrouped after Houghton took its quick lead, tying the game 1-1 on a goal by Lucas Krol with 1:37 left in the opening period.

Dallas Hood scored what proved to be the winning goal, skating left to right across the slot and putting a shot inside the far post with 1:20 left in the second period to make it a 2-1 game.

The Gremlins (23-6-1) had a five-on-three power play for the first 1 minute, 26 seconds of the third period. Not only did they fail to capitalize on the two-man advantage, but they allowed a goal at the 2:01 mark to Mickey VanAntwerp.

"The biggest turning point in the game was we didn't score on the five-on-three," Houghton coach Corey Markham said. "We had a couple good looks and just missed. Very shortly after, they scored to make it 3-1. That was a huge point in the game. We didn't quite recover and get enough offensive push after that point."

Krol sent his second goal of the game into an empty net with 52.7 seconds remaining to end the scoring.

Houghton was attempting to win its first MHSAA championship since 1982. The Gremlins have lost four times in the championship game since then.

"It's a once-in-a-lifetime thing," Houghton senior defenseman Kevin Bostwick said. "Our community is just so special. They're always behind us. It hurts really bad not to bring this one home to them."

Houghton goalie Jimmy Pietila made 23 saves.

HARTLAND ICES REMATCH TO COMPLETE REPEAT

When Adam Pietila won a national championship with his travel hockey team in 2018, nobody in Hartland outside of his family knew about it.

When he won an MHSAA Division 2 championship with Hartland last March at USA Hockey Arena, he did so in front of a large student section and with his best friends at the school.

"This is better," said the Hartland sophomore, who scored the Eagles' third goal in a 4-0 shutout of Trenton. "Going to school with everybody every day is just a great time."

It's the experience of playing for one's school, in front of kids that players see every day in class, that coach Rick Gadwa pitches to talented players in Hartland who are on the fence about playing high school hockey.

The scene at USA Hockey Arena, with players jumping up against the glass to celebrate with the student section, could be Exhibit A in that sales pitch.

"You want to have a place where guys can come play where they're feeling the love, where maybe sometimes they weren't or it's a different look or another stop for them," said Gadwa, who played for Hartland 16 years ago. "More important, the pride of high school hockey, the pride of playing for your school, that stuff you don't get in AAA or AA hockey. It's a real special thing when you can come play for your school."

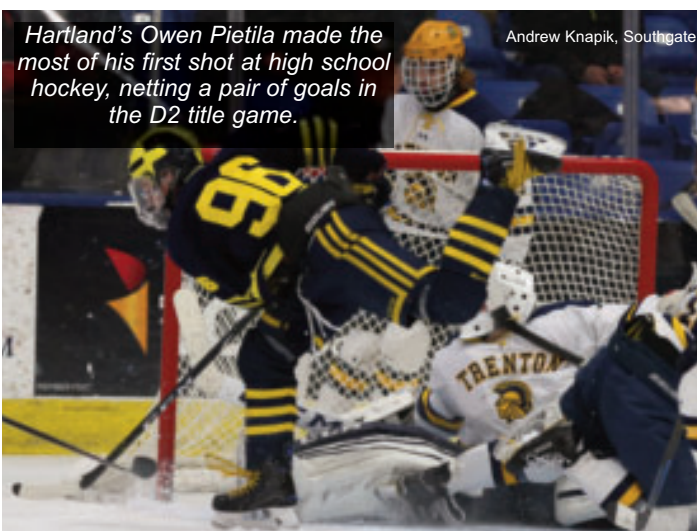
Two of the newcomers to the Eagles in their quest to repeat were the Pietila brothers, Adam and Owen. Owen, a senior, scored two goals eight seconds apart to break a scoreless deadlock late in the first period after Hartland failed to cash in on a long five-on-three power play.

Owen Pietila made up his mind to play for Hartland after watching the Eagles beat Trenton in the 2018 championship game.

"It looked like fun," he said.

The Division 2 ranks were dominated all season by four powerhouse programs: Hartland, Trenton, Livonia Stevenson and Birmingham Brother Rice.

In the end, there was no doubt which team was the best in the division. Hartland (27-4) beat Brother Rice, 6-2, in the Semifinals before outshooting the Trojans, 44-13, in a dominant performance in the title game.

Trenton was hoping to avenge a 4-2 loss to the Eagles in the prior championship game. The Trojans (25-5-1) came in with confidence, having shut out Hartland, 2-0, on Feb. 1. But Hartland was in command from start to finish, getting the first 11 shots of the game and 17 of the first 18.

"The first time we played them, we had a few bounces go our way," Trenton coach Chad Clements said. "They had a few bounces go their way tonight. They outshot us two-to-one the last time we played them. I kind of expected that, just because of how offensive they were. I was fine with being outshot. As long as we kept the shots from the outside, we were fine with that."

Adam Pietila's goal at 13:47 of the second period came on the rebound of a Benny Tervo shot on a breakaway. Gabe Anderson completed the scoring with 4:33 left in the game.

Brett Tome made 13 saves to backstop the Eagles to the Division 2 championship for the second straight time. He had a 12-0 career record as a playoff starter, allowing only seven goals and posting seven shutouts.

DCC DREAM COMES TRUE

Brendan Hill was hooked on high school hockey long before he played his first shift at Detroit Catholic Central.

"When I was like 8 years old, I would come to these games and watch," said Hill, a senior defenseman. "I had a dream to play at CC. It just happened. There's no words for it."

The dream came with a dream ending for Hill and the Shamrocks' 12 seniors, as their final act in a Catholic Central uniform was celebrating an MHSAA Division 1 championship after a 3-1 victory over Saginaw Heritage last March.

The game was played before an enthusiastic crowd of about 3,000 fans, including two large and vocal student sections.

"You have all your closest buddies up there going bananas," senior forward Carter Korpi said. "It's awesome. It makes it that much better."

The atmosphere in which the game was played is the biggest selling point for coaches like Catholic Central's Brandon Kaleniecki when they try to persuade students in their own hallways to choose the high school game over the travel ranks.

Another selling point is the caliber of play in Michigan. There was a time when Catholic Central would steamroll through the MHSAA Tournament, facing little opposition. Those days are gone.

The Shamrocks had to survive a 1-0 Quarterfinal with Salem and a 4-2 Semifinal with Rochester United and needed an empty-net goal in the final minute before they could exhale against Heritage.

"Obviously, there are a lot of big programs out there," Kaleniecki said. "That's what makes winning so difficult, because you never know. The last three games were all close, tight games that required everything we had to get through it. There is a lot of talent in the state of Michigan. There is a lot of talent in high school hockey."

It was the 14th MHSAA title for the Shamrocks, tying them with Trenton for second most all-time. Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook Kingswood leads the way with 17 titles.

Getting to the Finish Line Surely and Safely

It has now been more than a year since the Covid-19 global pandemic changed everyday life and brought an abrupt end to the MHSAA Winter tournaments of 2020, on March 12 of 2020 to be exact.

Thousands of students could not see through to the end all of their efforts in basketball, gymnastics, ice hockey and LP boys swimming and diving.

Little did we know then that thousands more would not have the opportunity to participate in *any* Spring sports. For seniors around Michigan and the country, that also resulted in no proms, graduations, or even stepping onto the college campus of their choice when fall rolled around.

It was against those seemingly insurmountable odds that the MHSAA – buoyed by its hard-working and dedicated membership – rolled up its sleeves and went to work to provide athletic opportunities in 2020-21 that were taken away from so many last school year.

Since last July, the goal of the MHSAA has been to have three seasons in this school year that all reached the finish line. It was at times a rollercoaster ride to rival any amusement park but thanks to the leadership of our schools and willingness of participants to conform to new and everchanging state guidelines, we made it to the end of the frenetic fall journey.

When the annual 2020 championships in LP girls swimming, volleyball and football concluded – in January of 2021, it was a sense of accomplishment.

However, a cloud of uncertainty still lingered over this Winter's games as the waiting game continued to realize enough decline in Covid numbers that would allow our students to return to buildings and athletic arenas. As with the summer leading up to this school year, and as our winter start dates were postponed time and again, the reality was that kids were going to be playing sports someplace. Period.

Since last May, that belief was proven consistently as athletic activity took place in the club, travel, AAU and non-school space nearly every day. The trend continued the longer school sports were put on hold at the start of 2021, putting our school seasons in greater jeopardy by forcing individuals and families to seek activity out-of-state. It was not only a violation of MDHHS orders, but sending all of those families into different states only served as an impediment to getting students back in school fulltime.

It was always our stance that we could contribute to students returning to in-person learning by allowing MHSAA member schools to begin full activities, participating locally and against more local competition, and under the guidance of trained, professional educators.

The last part – under the guidance of professional educators – is the most important during these times, and thanks to our schools, we proved that notion true.

When four sports saw their seasons interrupted in late November, the MHSAA membership was determined not to let those students suffer the same fate as those did a year ago. Thus, we were allowed to complete fall sports because those teams took part in the MDHHS rapid testing pilot program. Results of that program were overwhelmingly positive. A total of 5,376 individuals (athletes, coaches, team personnel, cheerleaders, etc.) were tested, and 57 – or 1 percent – tested posi-

tive at some point in the pilot. Nearly 30,000 rapid antigen tests were administered – and 99.8 percent were negative. This showed that not only could contact sports be played, but more importantly could be played safely.

Non-contact Winter sports – girls and boys bowling, girls gymnastics, girls and boys alpine skiing and girls and boys swimming & diving – began full participation without delay in mid-January. On Feb. 4, the MHSAA received permission to set start dates for the rest of the Winter sports, with various MDHHS mask mandates in place for numerous sports, and yet additional rapid testing in place for wrestling. While there have been pauses and issues with teams over the past weeks, once again our schools have demonstrated that Winter sports can be played safely. This advocacy for activity will continue for our Spring sports to follow in the coming months.

Our goal from last July is now two-thirds complete. With today's Finals, these students that have endured so much since November have reached the finish line. In school sports, the lessons learned in competition often last a lifetime and for the Class of 2021, they have shown us all how to keep persevering, grinding and believing during some of the most difficult days in the past century.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2021

The Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 32 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2020-21 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$1,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2021-22 school year. This year, a total of 1,356 applications from 418 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored in a virtual ceremony later this spring. Details and a video of the ceremony will be posted on MHSAA.com.

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year earlier.

Those eight new members were selected from a record-high 179 applicants, twice as many as generally apply for SAC positions every year.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 117 schools from 45 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in nine MHSAA sports, and seven will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
