THINGS TO DO

#### If you need to kill an hour

Walk around downtown Battle Creek. You can start at the Welcome Center. Tony the Tiger thinks a selfie with him would be Grrrrrrrrreat! We also have information about the area, suggestions for places to eat or things to do, and souvenirs.

Make sure to bring some quarters for the pinball arcade while you're near McCamly Hotel, as well.

Hangout suggestion: Look for the Players Lounge at Kellogg Arena. Whether you need a hydration break or a table to empty your bag onto, you'll still be close to the action. There will be beanbags to lounge on and snacks to eat. Kellogg Arena has a charging station, if you need it.

## If you have the evening open

Battle Creek has three movie theaters. NCG Movies is located at Lakeview Square Mall (5775 Beckley Road), so it is right by Barnes and Noble, Dunham's, Target and Meijer. It also tends to have the most movies. West Columbia 7 (2500 W. Columbia Ave.) is a little farther out, but it has the best seats. JC Cinema (15375 Helmer Road) prices are cheaper than the others.

Hangout suggestion: Barnes and Noble is open until 9 p.m., with all the important amenities in reach: Frappes, WiFi, magazines and books.

## If your next game is a day away

When your hotel doesn't have a pool, you can get a day pass to the Battle Creek YMCA. For shopping, head out to Harper Village on Beckley Road. There's a Meijer and Walgreens if you need essentials, a Kohl's and TJ Maxx for clothes and a Best Buy and a GameStop for electronics. Ulta Beauty offers make-up consultations, if

you want to see what's new. Plus, it's free! For a team-building exercise, try an escape room. Cereal City Escape is located at the mall and has two different puzzle challenges: solve a crime or commit a crime. If vampires are more your thing, go to Bowlero Lanes for Escape Room-Zone, where you have to get out of Dracula's Lair.

Hangout suggestion: Biggby is going to get crazy, so cut across the Riverwalk parking lot and 32 Social is right across the street - it's only a few minutes of walking.

Once you have your coffee or hot chocolate, go down the hall to the Lincoln Room for couches and tables. Why is it called the Lincoln Room? There's a giant portrait of Abraham Lincoln made out of pennies. It won ArtPrize in 2017.

There are plenty of outlets for charging devices and ask 32 Social for the WiFi password.







## If you want a unique team photo

Do you want a team photo that's a little more interesting than standing in the gym? Here are some popular spots for portraits:

- The "love" graffiti mural makes a great backdrop. You'll find it at 15 W. Michigan Ave.
- If you don't mind leaving downtown, Historic Bridge Park (14930 9 Mile Road) has some very photogenic bridges, like the red trestle bridge that adds a pop of color to any photo.
- If you're looking for a classy backdrop, the Record Box (15 Carlyle St.) has a simple brick façade that any VSCO Girl would love.
