CLINTON REACHES TOP

In 2019 when Clinton wrestling co-coach Jeff Rolland walked off the mat after the MHSAA Division 4 Team Final, he said, "Until someone beats them, they are the one everyone is chasing."

"They" were the Hudson Tigers, who had just beaten Rolland's up-and-coming Clinton team to win their third-straight Division 4 title.

So Rolland and his team went back to work during the offseason, recalling how they felt wrestling for a championship only to come up short against a program that is comfortable on that stage.

Spin it forward one year to 2020, and Clinton found itself back on the big stage against the Tigers, and that hard work and self-confidence paid off. This time, Clinton beat Hudson 36-27 at Wings Event Center, clinching the first team wrestling championship in school history.

"This took us believing in each other as a family," Rolland said. "We believe this program is a family, (kindergarten through 12th grade), to the parents and the community, and this took us digging down and focusing on who we are – focusing on us."

That focus was tested even before this weekend began, as top-ranked Clinton entered Friday's Quarterfinals as the third seed in Division 4.

The team then had to go through a very tough New Lothrop team in the Semifinals to get to Hudson.

"We felt we had enough. We just had to come and compete and prove it," Rolland said. "We took on the mantra that it was us against everybody. Until we prove, we are going to get the three seed, we are going to get the hardest matches. And we said good."

But it wasn't all good in the Final, especially early.

Starting at the 119-pound weight class, Hudson jumped out to an 18-0 lead through the first four matches.

But then came the strength of Clinton's lineup, going on to win eight of the next nine weight classes to earn their first team title.

During that stretch, Clinton got technical fall victories from A.J. Baxter, Kent McCombs and Brayden Randolph and a pair of pins from Logan Badge and Jack Voll.

Badge said his team was not too worked up by being down so much early.

"We were still confident in ourselves," said Badge, a returning Individual Finals champion. "We knew our capabilities, knowing we were able to score and get bonus points when we needed."

DIVISION 2 Lowell 53, Gaylord 4

When talking about a dynasty, Lowell wrestling coach R.J. Boudro says the cause and effect of his program's reaches far outside of his wrestling room.

Boudro and Red Arrows added to their dynasty in 2020 at the Wings Event Center when they won their seventh straight – and 10th overall – Division 2 team championship with a convincing 53-4 victory over previously-unbeaten Gaylord.

The win extended the team's MHSAA record for consecutive Team Finals championships, which Lowell took over alone with their sixth in a row in 2019.

"Dynasty is a community; it's all about community," Boudro said. "It's about the kids. You see all of the young kids here today. It's about parents, it's about community, and Lowell is a great community and we are lucky to be involved."

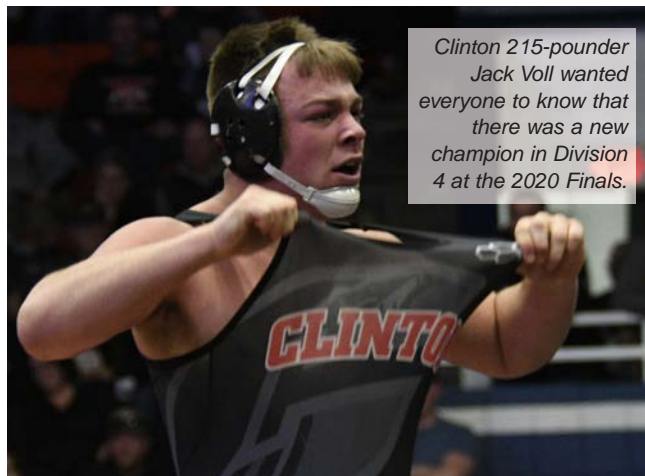
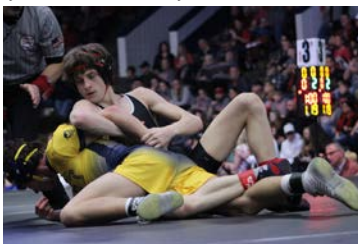
It didn't take long for Lowell to muscle control away from the Blue Devils.

Starting at the 119-pound weight class, Red Arrows senior **Nick Korhorn** (right) won by technical fall, 15-0. From there, Lowell won 13 of 14 matches. During that stretch, there were some very big individual matchups – like the one at 145 pounds.

There, Lowell three-time Individual Finals champion Austin Boone scored a major decision victory over two-time individual champion and three-time finalist Chayse LaJoie, 11-3.

Boone would write his name in the wrestling history book the next weekend at Ford Field, becoming just the second wrestler in the state to win four individual and four team titles. He joined former Davison legend Brent Metcalf in earning that achievement.

It was the second time in three years that Gaylord lost to Lowell in the Final.

DIVISION 3 Dundee 44, Richmond 18

Nobody was quite ready to definitively call the 2020 Dundee wrestling team the best in program history. But simply being in the conversation says enough.

The Vikings put an exclamation point on a dominant season by defeating rival Richmond 44-18 in the Division 3 championship match at Wings Event Center. It was the third-straight title for Dundee, and the program's 12th overall.

The Vikings finished the season 23-1, won the Lenawee County Athletic Association title, and qualified 13 of 14 wrestlers who qualified for the MHSAA Individual Finals.

Dundee won eight matches in a row after the opening bout to put the dual out of reach. Aiden Davis started the run with an 11-3 major decision at 125, followed by Austin Fietz's 6-4 overtime win at 130. Dundee then put the top-ranked wrestler in the Division on the mat in five of the next six weight classes, getting pins from Casey Swiderski (135) and **Tyler Swiderski** (above, 152), and major decisions from Kyle Yuhas (140), Christian Killion (145), Dominic Lomazzo (160) and Stoney Buell (171).

By the time the strongest part of Richmond's lineup stepped on the mat in the upper weights, the Vikings had clinched the title.



DIVISION 1 Detroit Catholic Central 34, Davison 23

Brendin Yatooma was blocking out all of the noise at Wings Events Center. The Detroit Catholic Central senior 215-pounder proudly hoisted the 2020 Division 1 MHSAA Team Wrestling Finals championship trophy over his head, a smile plastered on his face.

Yatooma and his teammates had just claimed the school's fourth straight title, defeating Davison 34-23 in a match that pitted rival powerhouses and drew heightened emotions across one corner of the arena.

The title was the 14th in Catholic Central history, but this was the first time the school had won four in a row.

Emotions ran highest during a pivotal match at 189 pounds, which featured two of the state's best wrestlers in Davison's Alex Facundo and Catholic Central's Manny Rojas. Facundo, a two-time Finals champion, was leading 5-2 in the second period when he was called for an illegal move. Rojas was evaluated on the mat for a concussion, and it was determined he could not continue. Catholic Central was awarded six points for the match, which gave the Shamrocks a 23-18 lead.

Catholic Central (20-3) clinched the dual in the next two weight classes, as Yatooma and **Steven Kolcheff** (above) picked up pins at 215 and 285, respectively. Davison (20-3) got decisions from Aden Williams (103) and Caden Horwath (112) to close out the dual.

Getting to the Finish Line Surely and Safely

It has now been more than a year since the Covid-19 global pandemic changed everyday life and brought an abrupt end to the MHSAA Winter tournaments of 2020, on March 12 of 2020 to be exact.

Thousands of students could not see through to the end all of their efforts in basketball, gymnastics, ice hockey and LP boys swimming and diving.

Little did we know then that thousands more would not have the opportunity to participate in *any* Spring sports. For seniors around Michigan and the country, that also resulted in no proms, graduations, or even stepping onto the college campus of their choice when fall rolled around.

It was against those seemingly insurmountable odds that the MHSAA – buoyed by its hard-working and dedicated membership – rolled up its sleeves and went to work to provide athletic opportunities in 2020-21 that were taken away from so many last school year.

Since last July, the goal of the MHSAA has been to have three seasons in this school year that all reached the finish line. It was at times a rollercoaster ride to rival any amusement park but thanks to the leadership of our schools and willingness of participants to conform to new and everchanging state guidelines, we made it to the end of the frenetic fall journey.

When the annual 2020 championships in LP girls swimming, volleyball and football concluded – in January of 2021, it was a sense of accomplishment.

However, a cloud of uncertainty still lingered over this Winter's games as the waiting game continued to realize enough decline in Covid numbers that would allow our students to return to buildings and athletic arenas. As with the summer leading up to this school year, and as our winter start dates were postponed time and again, the reality was that kids were going to be playing sports someplace. Period.

Since last May, that belief was proven consistently as athletic activity took place in the club, travel, AAU and non-school space nearly every day. The trend continued the longer school sports were put on hold at the start of 2021, putting our school seasons in greater jeopardy by forcing individuals and families to seek activity out-of-state. It was not only a violation of MDHHS orders, but sending all of those families into different states only served as an impediment to getting students back in school fulltime.

It was always our stance that we could contribute to students returning to in-person learning by allowing MHSAA member schools to begin full activities, participating locally and against more local competition, and under the guidance of trained, professional educators.

The last part – under the guidance of professional educators – is the most important during these times, and thanks to our schools, we proved that notion true.

When four sports saw their seasons interrupted in late November, the MHSAA membership was determined not to let those students suffer the same fate as those did a year ago. Thus, we were allowed to complete fall sports because those teams took part in the MDHHS rapid testing pilot program. Results of that program were overwhelmingly positive. A total of 5,376 individuals (athletes, coaches, team personnel, cheerleaders, etc.) were tested, and 57 – or 1 percent – tested posi-

tive at some point in the pilot. Nearly 30,000 rapid antigen tests were administered – and 99.8 percent were negative. This showed that not only could contact sports be played, but more importantly could be played safely.

Non-contact Winter sports – girls and boys bowling, girls gymnastics, girls and boys alpine skiing and girls and boys swimming & diving – began full participation without delay in mid-January. On Feb. 4, the MHSAA received permission to set start dates for the rest of the Winter sports, with various MDHHS mask mandates in place for numerous sports, and yet additional rapid testing in place for wrestling. While there have been pauses and issues with teams over the past weeks, once again our schools have demonstrated that Winter sports can be played safely. This advocacy for activity will continue for our Spring sports to follow in the coming months.

Our goal from last July is now two-thirds complete. With today's Finals, these students that have endured so much since November have reached the finish line. In school sports, the lessons learned in competition often last a lifetime and for the Class of 2021, they have shown us all how to keep persevering, grinding and believing during some of the most difficult days in the past century.

Scholar-Athlete Class of 2021

The Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 32 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2020-21 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$1,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2021-22 school year. This year, a total of 1,356 applications from 418 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored in a virtual ceremony later this spring. Details and a video of the ceremony will be posted on MHSAA.com.

Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The MHSAA Representative Council

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The Council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but five elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, nonpublic schools, and junior and middle schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his/her designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.
