


# 2022 MHSAA Team Wrestling Finals

# DAVISON SLAYS D1 GIANT

**C**ameron Freeman tweaked his knee days earlier and admittedly was in a lot of pain. The Davison junior still stepped in and gutted out perhaps the biggest win of the season for the Cardinals.

With his team up 26-21 with two matches remaining against four-time reigning Division 1 champion Detroit Catholic Central, the junior 130-pounder went out on the mat and held off his opponent for a 3-2 victory, clinching the 2021 Division 1 title for Davison by an eventual 29-24 score.

It marked Davison's first Finals win since 2006, as the Cardinals lost in the championship matches five times since then, including 2020's 34-23 defeat to Catholic Central.

"For him to go out there with his knee hurting is amazing. He stepped up for us," said Davison coach Roy Hall. "He has a meniscus issue and I know he's in a lot of pain. But he wanted to go out there and win for us."

Freeman staved off DCC's Anthony Walker in the third period. Walker recorded a takedown and was trying for a second takedown in the waning seconds before time expired.

"This is for the seniors," said Freeman. "Earlier in the week, I was suffering from a knee injury. I came back and just did this for the seniors. This is the best team I've ever been on."

The Cardinals now own nine Finals team titles and six runner-up trophies. Of those five championship match losses over the last eight years, four were to DCC.

"How sweet it is — it's awesome for these kids," added Hall. "We came close last year and maybe we could have won that meet but came up short. I'm pretty accomplished as a coach, but these kids have never accomplished this before."

Both teams won seven matches on the day. Davison recorded three decisions, two technical fall victories, one major decision and one pin to record the narrow five-point victory over the Shamrocks.

Catholic Central (21-2) had won 15 Finals team titles dating back to 1969 — eight during the previous decade — and finished in the runner-up slot only twice before this year. The Shamrocks were trying to become just the second Division 1 school to win five team titles in a row.

Previously, Davison captured five straight from 2002-2006.

Earlier in the month, Davison won a match between the two 36-9.



## DIVISION 2 Lowell 59, Goodrich 7

Not even a pandemic and a shortened season can slow down Lowell. Nothing. At least in recent years.

The top-ranked and top-seeded Red Arrows extended their MHSAA record of consecutive Team Finals titles to eight with a resounding 59-7 victory over third-seeded Goodrich in the 2021 Division 2 championship match at Wings Arena.

"I can't say enough about these kids," said Lowell coach R.J. Boudro, who in his seven seasons as head coach has amassed an impressive 137-21 record.

Lowell wasted no time in setting the tone, earning a pair of first-period pins for a 12-0 lead. Cole Huisman (140) earned a pin in only 29 seconds and William Link (145) followed suit by sticking his opponent to the mat in a mere 35 seconds.

Leading 35-0 through seven matches, Lowell 285-pounder Keegan Nugent earned another pin in just 16 seconds to clinch the title for the Red Arrows (20-3).

"Effort," beamed Nugent. "We have great effort as a team. It's all about tradition and doing what you need to do to keep it going," continued Nugent. "Not looking at what other people are doing, just working your butt off to contribute to the tradition."

Overall, Lowell's dominating effort resulted in wins in 12 of the 14 weight classes. The Red Arrows collected six pins, three decisions, two victories by technical fall and one major decision.

The title is not only the eighth straight for the powerful Red Arrows, it gives Lowell its 11th Finals title over the past 20 seasons. Tuesday also marked Lowell's 17th appearance in the Division 2 Final over 23 years. The Red Arrows are 11-6 in title bouts dating back to 1999.

Goodrich (18-1) slipped to 2-4 all-time in Finals matches, including losing to Lowell in 2019 (29-23) in the title bout.

## DIVISION 3 Dundee 55, Whitehall 17

The Dundee wrestling team found itself in an unfamiliar position at the 2021 Division 3 Final: behind. The Vikings were dominant all season. They featured eight wrestlers ranked No. 1 in their weight class, and lost just once — against Division 1 champion Davison.

But thanks to wins from Whitehall's Max Brown and Marco Moore, which sandwiched a long technology delay, Dundee had to spend nearly 30 minutes trailing on the scoreboard.

It didn't take nearly as long for the Swiderski brothers — Casey and Tyler — to erase the deficit, though, as they re-established a Dundee lead that was never relinquished in a 55-17 victory.

It was the fourth straight title for the Vikings, and 13th overall. It's the second time Dundee has won four straight titles, as the Vikings also won from 1995-98 in Division 4 and Class C-D (1995).

Whitehall kept things interesting for a while, though. Brown's victory came in overtime against top-ranked Austin Fietz at 140 pounds and was followed by Moore's decision at 145. Casey Swiderski won by technical fall at 152, followed by a major decision from his brother Tyler at 160.

Dundee closed the match with six straight victories to clinch the title, getting pins from Kade Kulce (103), Braeden Davis (112), **Kaden Chinavere** (above right, 119), Logan Sander (125) and Aiden Davis (135). Trey Parker won by major decision at 130.



## DIVISION 4 Clinton 55, New Lothrop 9

The Clinton wrestling program took its place at the top of Division 4 in 2020, claiming the first Finals title in school history. In 2021, it emphatically announced that it's there to stay.

Clinton rolled through its competition throughout the day, topped off with a 55-9 win against New Lothrop to claim its second-straight Division 4 title.

Clinton was dominant throughout the postseason, and closed it out the same way, winning 76-6 in the Quarterfinal against Ravenna and 59-9 in the Semifinal against Leslie.

And in case there was any doubt remaining about the program's status, Clinton has won its titles against the two programs that had dominated the division for more than a decade prior — Hudson (2020) and New Lothrop.

It was Landis Gillman who started Clinton off with a bang in the Finals, as he bumped up to 140 pounds and won by major decision against New Lothrop's Andrew Krupp.

Clinton won the first six matches of the dual, five by major decision — by Gillman, Kent McCombs (145), AJ Baxter (152), Spencer Konz (160) and **Logan Badge** (above, 189) — and one with a first-period pin from Brayden Randolph (171).

# Title IX Turns 50, and Results Speak Volumes

To say that American female athletes dominated the recent Olympics in Tokyo would be an understatement. Among the 66 medals earned by American female Olympians – most by any country in the history of the Games – were gold-medal performances by the U.S. basketball, volleyball, water polo and beach volleyball teams. Eighteen medals were earned by the U.S. women swimmers, female track and field athletes claimed 15 medals, and the U.S. women’s softball and soccer teams won silver and bronze medals, respectively.

In the past 30 years of the Olympic Games, the United States has dominated the women’s team sports of basketball (nine golds), soccer (four golds, one silver, one bronze) and softball (three golds, two silvers) — not to mention the untold number of medals in track and field. And this past summer, the U.S. women’s volleyball team claimed its first gold medal.

These performances by some of our nation’s most skilled female athletes never would have been possible without the passage of Title IX and the offerings of these sports through our nation’s schools. With the chance to play afforded by the landmark Title IX legislation in 1972, girls participation in several high school sports skyrocketed in the years that followed.

When the NFHS conducted its first participation survey in 1971, basketball and outdoor track and field were the primary girls sports, comprising about two-thirds of the 294,000 total. However, with the opportunity to play additional sports, girls flocked to volleyball and softball first, along with cross country and eventually soccer.

Soccer, in fact, has had the most remarkable growth. In 1971, only 700 girls were playing high school soccer. Twenty-five years later, that number had climbed to almost 210,000; and as the 50th anniversary of Title IX approaches, there are now almost 400,000 girls playing high school soccer – a staggering 56,200 percentage increase in 50 years. Soccer now ranks fourth in popularity among girls high school sports – all because of that opportunity in 1972.

There are many other success stories, however. The pre-Title IX survey in 1971 indicated that 1,719 girls were participating in cross country. With increases every year until 2015, today, there are 219,345 girls competing in high school programs and the sport ranks sixth in popularity.

Although participation numbers have leveled a bit the past 10 years, fast-pitch softball is another sport that flourished after the passage of Title IX. With fewer than 10,000 participants in 1971, the numbers quickly rose to 220,000 by 1985 and 343,000 by 2000, and softball is currently fifth among girls sports with 362,038 participants.

Since track and field and basketball were the primary sports in the early days of girls sports programs, increases in those sports have not been as dramatic; however, they remain the first and third most-popular sports, respectively,

today. Volleyball, however, much like soccer, continues its upward climb.

Without a doubt, volleyball has seen the steadiest increases among girls high school sports the past 50 years. After starting with 17,952 participants in 1971, the numbers jumped to 300,810 by 1990 and 409,332 by 2010 and 452,808 by 2018. During its climb, volleyball surpassed basketball as the No. 2 girls sport.

And among the top six girls sports from 2010 to 2018 (numbers are not available the past two years due to the pandemic), volleyball has gained the most participants (43,476), followed by soccer (32,549). And all of this has occurred thanks to legislation passed in 1972 that was not fundamentally meant to address opportunities for girls to participate in high school sports.

The NFHS is leading a yearlong celebration of the 50th anniversary of Title IX, which officially occurs on June 23, 2022. “Title IX at 50 – Celebrating and Growing Opportunities” is highlighting the law’s impact by celebrating the inspirational individuals and landmark moments in the history of Title IX, and continuing to grow the educational and competitive opportunities for the future.

# Scholar-Athlete Class of 2022

The Michigan High School Athletic Association/Farm Bureau Insurance Scholar-Athlete Award has been recognizing the top student-athletes for 33 years. Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously won a varsity letter. Applicants also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay on the importance of sportsmanship in educational athletics.

Recipients of the 2021-22 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$2,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 2022-23 school year. This year, a total of 1,434 applications from 407 schools were received for the 32 scholarships. Class A students were guaranteed 12 winners, Class B eight winners, Class C six winners and Class D four winners. Two at-large winners were also selected.

All scholarship recipients will be honored during the MHSAA Boys Basketball Finals at the Breslin Center in East Lansing this March.

# Student Advisory Council Aids MHSAA

**E**ight student-athletes who are juniors at their schools during the 2021-22 academic year have been selected to serve two-year terms on the Michigan High School Athletic Association's Student Advisory Council.

The Student Advisory Council is a 16-member group which provides feedback on issues impacting educational athletics from a student's perspective, and also is involved in the operation of Association championship events and other programming. Members of the Student Advisory Council serve for two years, beginning as juniors. Eight new members are selected annually to serve on the SAC, with nominations made by MHSAA member schools. The incoming juniors will join the group of eight seniors-to-be appointed a year ago.

Selected to begin serving on the Student Advisory Council in 2021-22 are: **Sam Gibson**, Plainwell; **Brady Leistra**, East Grand Rapids; **Caroline Li**, Okemos; **Sam Matias**, Lansing Catholic; **Zar'ria Mitchell**, Saginaw Heritage; **Carney Salo**, Escanaba; **Brandon Thompson**, Petersburg Summerfield; and **Keira Tolmie**, Clarkston.

Those eight new members were selected from 114 applicants. That applicant total was 40 percent more than the total number of applicants who generally apply for SAC positions every year.

Applications for the next SAC class can be found on MHSAA.com are now being accepted through April 25.

The first Student Advisory Council was formed for the 2006-07 school year. With the addition of this class beginning this summer, members will have represented 122 schools from 46 leagues plus independent schools that do not play in a league. Combined, the new appointees have participated in 12 MHSAA sports, and five will be the first SAC members from their respective schools.

The Student Advisory Council generally meets seven times each school year, and once more for a 24-hour leadership camp. Last school year, due to COVID-19, the Council met nearly twice as many times, but virtually all but once when members met for an outdoor, socially-distanced session.
