#### **SPORTSMANSHIP**

Both players and spectators should display good sportsmanship, cheering for good, winning points by either school and refraining from cheering when opponents make errors, Additionally, MHSAA Reg V, Sec 3, prohibits "actions by players or spectators which are intended to bait, anger, embarrass, ridicule or demean others or berates needles or threatens." Such actions may result in penalties assessed against the player/team including disqualification and removal of players or spectators from the site.

# SELECTED RULES AND REGULATIONS For MHSAA Tennis Championships

- 1. USTA rules will be applied except where noted. MHSAA Regulations have changed some of the USTA rules. Players shall play by The Code (USTA). It is the server's responsibility to call out the score before each serve.
- 2. <u>Scoring System</u> All matches shall be the best of three sets with the **Coman** tie-break method used to decide a set at 6-all. This is identical to the regular 7-point tiebreak except that after the first point, then after every four points, and at the end of the tiebreak. The player whose turn it is to serve shall serve the first point of the tiebreak. The player/team serving that first point shall be the receiver in the first game of the next set.
- 3. <u>Before Matches</u> Players due to be called for matches are asked to stay within hearing distance of the officials desk. When matches are announced, players must be available to immediately report to the desk for their court assignment, name cards (if in use) and tennis balls and then proceed directly to the court assigned.
- 4 <u>"Lateness for Match" Penalty</u> Coaches should have players at the tournament site at least 15 minutes before the posted starting times of their match. It is the responsibility of each player after winning any round of a tournament, to learn the scheduled starting time of his or her next match. When exact times are not available, they should wait in an area where they can hear the tournament officials calling matches to court.

A contestant late for his or her match may be penalized accordingly:

- a. Up to 5 minutes from call loss of toss plus one game
- b. Five minutes to less than ten loss of toss and 2 games
- c. Ten minutes to less than fifteen loss of toss and 3 games
- d. Fifteen or more minutes default
- 5. Team Uniform Shall meet the requirements set forth in "The Tennis Coaches Manual".
- Penalty: Match shall not The USTA Point Penalty System for lateness will be used.
- <u>6. Warm-Up</u> –Warm-up before each match shall not exceed 10 min. including the serves.
- 7. Change Over At end of each odd game (even after the first game of each set).
- <u>8. Rest</u> Between matches, a player or doubles team will receive at least 30 minutes.

  This may be shortened if both coaches agree. A 2-minute break is allowed between the first and second set and a maximum of 5 minutes between the second and third set.

## 9. Coaching:

- A. Coaching is permitted only during the 90-second changeover and during the set break (2 minutes) or during the split sets break (5 minutes). On the changeover, a maximum of 90 seconds shall elapse from the moment the ball goes out of play at the end of the game to the time the ball is struck for the first point of the next game. Coaches must leave time for players to get back to the baseline within the 90 seconds.
- B. Coaching should be done from outside the fence (exceptions made by officials only). Only one coach may be on a court ay any one time
- A violation of the 90 second rule will be assessed by: the USTA penalty for time violations on changeovers (1st offense warning, subsequent offenses one point for each offense.

- C. Number of Coaches On Friday, 3 coaches will be permitted One at Stowe Stadium and One each for the upper and lower levels at the WMU courts.


  Point Penalty Ststem for Misconduct
- a. First Offense Warning; b. 2nd Offense Point; c. 3rd Offense Match An immediate default is possible for an intentional or flagrant offense. At any time an official may bypass a step of the point penalty system if, in the opinion of the official, the offense was of such a nature that a more stringent penalty should be imposed. Violation of the rules by a coach and/or poor conduct exhibited by a coach or spectators could result in the application of the above penalty system on a player or team for the match in question. The point penalty system shall be cumulative for the duration of any match and the tournament. Penalties assessed at Regionals will be carried forward.
- 11. Penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct after match For flagrant Unsportsmanlike Conduct during or after a match, the offending player (or team non-player) will be defaulted and/or removed from the site as soon as authorized school personnel become available. This removal will be for the duration of the event (Regional and Finals are considered one event). In addition, one point will be deducted from the player's team score. This rule will be in effect for all MHSAA Tennis Tournaments. NOTE: If a player is defaulted for unsportsmanlike conduct, a substitution at his/her position is not allowed.
- 12. <u>Line Calls & Request for an Umpire</u> Umpires will rule on line calls they have observed only upon appeal by a player. Only a coach may request an Umpire to stay on court for a particular match. (Unless no coach is at the site.) The request might not be granted. It is at the discretion of the Tournament Manager or Site Referee.
- 13. Player Position in Final Meet Members of qualified teams must compete in the same Flight in the Final Level as in the Regional Level
- 14. Substitutions (MHSAA Tournament Play) If a substitute was used for a player in the Regional and that team qualifies for the Finals, the player for whom the substitution was made may represent the school in the Finals. At the Finals level, substitution is to be allowed only in cases of illness or injury, discipline, immediate family tragedy or academic commitment. The school must submit in writing the reason and the name of the substitute. After the Final Draw, no additions can be made and the substitute is the player of record. In case of injury or illness, causing the player to be unable to play, no substitute is allowed and default is awarded the opponent.
- 15. <u>Competition Limits:</u> A player or doubles team is generally limited to 3 matches per day. A fourth match in the day can be played to complete the tournament provided that an involved contestant has not played more than six sets in the first three rounds and there is mutual agreement to do so by both coaches and the tournament manager.
- 16. <u>Final Level Entries</u> The winning and runner-up team from each regional, and any team that scored 18 or more points in a draw of 16, qualified to the Final Meet. (Any school with 10 or more points in a draw of 8 also qualified to the Final Meet.) Any #1 Flight singles winner or runner-up who was not a member of a qualified team, qualified for the Final Meet. The #1 Flight draw includes the #1 Flight team players and all individual qualifiers.
- 17. <u>Team Scoring</u> Each match won by a team member by play or default will count as one point toward a team total score (in case of bye in the first round, a player/team must win the second round match before they receive a point for the bye.) The team score is based on the total cumulative points earned within each flight.






