PERCEPTION IS REALITY

It is critical that crews recognize the importance of not displaying uated from the moment you walk onto the field for pregame warm ups and even the amount of time you spending talking with each head coach can create the impression that you favor one team over another. The pregame conference should be concise and businesslike. Get the information you need while remaining cordial, and then move onto your next responsibility.

It is equally important that you carry that same demeanor at other time before and during the game as well. All discussions should be brief, professional and only in reference to the game at-hand. Avoid glad-handing, hugging or similar contact other than a handshake.

TIMEOUTS

Please review where on the field timeouts may take place and what activity is permitted. Timeouts come in two varieties: Team charged timeouts and official's timeouts. During a team charged timeout or an official's timeout for (1) a heat break, (2) media break, or (3) intermissions between periods or scores, the team may conference either inside or outside the 9-yard marks. During an official's timeout for a potentially injured player, the conference can only take place outside the 9-yard marks.

If outside the 9-yard marks, the timeout must be in front of the team box and can include any number of players and coaches. If inside the 9-yard marks, it may only include a single coach and no more than 11 players.

While electronic communication devices are prohibited to relay information to a player in the game, an exception is during an out- by the required deadline (9/15/21) on the next page. side the 9-yard mark conference.

POSTSEASON REQUIREMENTS

The deadline for postseason requirements is Wednesday, Sepeven the appearance of impropriety of partiality. You are being eval- tember 22, 2021. This is the last opportunity you have to submit all your requirements in order to qualify. Rules meetings must be completed to even officiate regular season high school games and you must be MIGS to work any level of the tournament. While tournament exams are not required for first round assignments, those that completed them will receive preference for assignments. Please remember that without the submission of regular season schedules, we cannot determine whether/where you have worked. Without the submission of your postseason availability, we do not know what dates you can be assigned. Finally, without submission of your primary and alternate positions, we don't know what crews you can ioin if needed and available.

POSTSEASON RECOMMENDATIONS

Assigners and Local Approved Associations were asked to submit recommendations for postseason consideration which include lists of officials in rank order. These lists are used to determine late round crew and individual assignments. When assigners or associations fail to submit recommendations by the deadline, it is at the detriment of the officials they represent.

Primary assigners and associations should submit recommendations separate and apart from one another. For instance, if an official is assigned by two different primary assigners and is also a member of an association, he/she could possibly receive up to three recommendations. In order for officials to know whether they're being represented adequately by their local leadership, I have included a list of primary assigners and associations that submitted recommendations

RULES REVIEW:

The last Rules Review asked your opinion on whether the offense was in an illegal formation, as seen HERE. We believe the tackles in this formation are not where they should be, but this is not quite a foul. We would put them in the "warning zone". It should be communicated to the players the need to move up to the line of scrimmage or risk having a foul called against them. See the next page for an example.
